Objectives of the Association and Qualifications – CARST Board of Directors

The objectives of the Association are:

- (a) to adopt, develop, establish and promote quality professional standards for the measurement of radon gas, and the abatement, mitigation and reduction of radon gas;
- (b) to provide opportunities for gathering, organizing, storing, sharing and disseminating information and knowledge relating to radon gas, the health effects of radon gas, and its abatement, mitigation and reduction;
- (c) to provide opportunities for liaison on matters related to radon gas between professionals and other interested public and private organizations; and,
- (d) to promote public awareness and education of radon gas measurement, the health effects of radon gas, and the abatement, mitigation and reduction of radon gas.

The Directors elected by the Membership shall meet the following qualifications:

- (a) Plenary Member of the Association in good standing.
- (b) At least eighteen (18) years of age.

Qualifications:

Any member who will meet the above qualifications and desires to put their name forward for election to the board of directors needs to state their intent to the chair of the nominating committee and the nominating committee will put forward a slate of recommendations at the annual general meeting for a vote, if required.
